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## TURNING LEAVES

Select a variety of autumn-colored hand-dyed fabrics to make this beautiful quilt.

#### **Project Specifications**

Skill Level: Intermediate Quilt Size: 85" x 105½" Block Size: 12" x 12" Number of Blocks: 18

#### **Materials**

- 18 fat quarters assorted hand-dyed mottleds
- 3% yards multicolor batik
- 4¾ yards tan mottled
- Backing 91" x 112"
- Batting 91" x 112"
- All-purpose thread to match fabric
- · Quilting thread
- 2 yards 12"-wide fusible web
- Basic sewing tools and supplies

#### Cutting

**Note:** Steps 1–4 refer to the cutting diagram in Figure 1.

**Step 1.** Cut a 94" length tan mottled; cut a 21¾" strip along the 94" length. Set aside remainder of length for Step 3.

**Step 2.** Cut the 21¾"-wide strip into two 12½" x 12½" H squares and three 21¾" x 21¾" G squares.

Cut each H square in half on one diagonal to make four H triangles. Cut each G square in half on both diagonals to make 12 G triangles. Set aside two G triangles for another project.

**Step 3.** Cut nine 8½" strips from the remainder of the 94" tan mottled strip; subcut strips into (18) 8½" A squares.

**Step 4.** Cut six 2½" strips from remainder of tan mottled strip; subcut strips into (36) 2½" D squares.



**Step 5.** From the remaining tan mottled yardage, cut (12) 27%" by fabric width strips; subcut strips into (162) 27%" B squares.

**Step 6.** Cut nine 2%" x 2%" C squares from each of the 18 hand-dyed mottleds as shown in Figure 2; sort by color into 18 stacks.



**Step 7.** Cut (19) 1" by fabric width E strips tan mottled.

**Step 8.** Cut (38) 1½" by fabric width F strips multicolor batik.

**Step 9.** Cut eight 1½" by fabric width strips multicolor batik. Join strips on short ends to make one long strip. Cut strip into two 86" I strips and two 67½" J strips.

**Step 10.** Cut eight 1" by fabric width strips tan mottled. Join strips on short ends to make one long strip. Cut strip

into two 88" K strips and two 681/2" L strips.

**Step 11.** Cut nine 2½" x 6½" M rectangles from each of the hand-dyed mottleds, again referring to Figure 2. Set aside six rectangles for another project.

**Step 12.** Cut four 6½" x 6½" N squares multicolor batik.

**Step 13.** Cut nine 1" by fabric width strips tan mottled. Join strips on short ends to make one long strip. Cut strip into two 101" O and two 81½" P strips.

**Step 14.** Cut nine 2½" by fabric width strips multicolor batik. Join strips on short ends to make one long strip. Cut strip into two 102" Q and two 85½" R strips.

**Step 15.** Prepare a template for the leaf shape using pattern given. Trace nine leaf shapes onto the fusible web; reverse pattern and trace nine reversed leaves.

**Step 16.** Cut out shapes, leaving a margin around each one. Fuse one shape to the wrong side of each hand-dyed mottled; cut out shapes on traced lines. Remove paper backing.

**Step 17.** Cut (10) 21/4" by fabric width strips multicolor batik for binding.

#### **Completing the Blocks**

**Step 1.** Draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each B square.

**Step 2.** Place a B square right sides together with a C square; stitch ¼" on each side of the marked line as shown in Figure 3.



**Step 3.** Cut the stitched unit apart on drawn line to make two B-C units, again referring to Figure 3. Repeat for all B-C squares to make 18 B-C units of each hand-dyed mottled.

**Step 4.** Join four B-C units as shown in Figure 4; repeat. Press seams in one direction.

**Step 5.** Sew a pieced strip to opposite sides of A as shown in Figure 5; press seams away from A.



**Step 6.** Join five B-C units with a D square as shown in Figure 6; press seams in one direction. Repeat for two pieced strips.

**Step 7.** Sew a pieced strip to the remaining sides of the pieced unit referring to the block drawing for positioning of strips; press seams away from A.

**Step 8.** Center a leaf on A, matching the leaf color to the C triangles and referring to the block drawing for positioning; fuse in place.

**Step 9.** Machine-stitch a blanket or buttonhole stitch around the leaf shape using all-purpose

thread to match fabric to complete one block. Repeat for 18 blocks. **Note:** Half of the blocks use reverse leaf shapes.

#### **Completing the Top**

**Step 1.** Sew an E strip between two F strips with right sides together along length; press seams toward F. Repeat for 19 strip sets.

**Step 2.** Subcut 16 strip sets into (48) 12½" E-F sashing strips as shown in Figure 7.



**Step 3.** Subcut the remaining three strip sets into (31) 3" E-F sashing squares, again referring to Figure 7.

**Step 4.** Referring to Figure 8 for positioning of leaf blocks, arrange the blocks in diagonal rows with the E-F sashing strips.



**Step 5.** Join blocks and strips in diagonal rows; press seams away from blocks.

**Step 6.** Join E-F sashing strips and sashing squares to make sashing rows as shown in Figure 9; press seams toward sashing strips.





**Step 7.** Join the block rows with the sashing rows and the G and H triangles to complete the pieced center; press seams away from block rows. **Note:** Refer to the Placement Diagram for placement of sashing rows to create a woven look.

**Step 8.** Sew an I strip to opposite sides and a J strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward I and J.

**Step 9.** Sew a K strip to opposite sides and an L strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward K and L.

**Step 10.** Join 44 M pieces in random order to make a side border strip; repeat for two strips. Press seams in one direction.

**Step 11.** Sew a strip to opposite sides of the pieced center; press seams toward M strips.

**Step 12.** Join 34 M pieces in random order to make a top strip; press seams in one direction. Repeat for a bottom strip. Sew an N square to each end of each strip; press seams away from N.

**Step 13.** Sew an M-N strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward M-N strips.

**Step 14.** Sew an O strip to opposite sides and a P strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward O and P.

**Step 15.** Sew a Q strip to opposite sides and an R strip to the top and bottom of the pieced center; press seams toward Q and R to complete the pieced top.

#### **Completing the Quilt**

**Step 1.** Press quilt top on both sides; check for proper seam pressing and trim all loose threads. **Step 2.** Sandwich batting

**Step 2.** Sandwich batting between the stitched top and the

prepared backing piece; pin or baste layers together to hold. Quilt on marked lines and as desired by hand or machine.

**Step 3.** When quilting is complete, remove pins or basting. Trim batting and backing fabric edges even with raw edges of quilt top.

**Step 4.** Join binding strips on short ends with diagonal seams to make one long strip; trim seams to ¼" and press seams open.


**Step 5.** Fold the binding strip in half with wrong sides together along length; press.

**Step 6.** Sew binding to quilt edges, matching raw edges, mitering corners and overlapping ends.

**Step 7.** Fold binding to the back side and stitch in place to finish. ◆

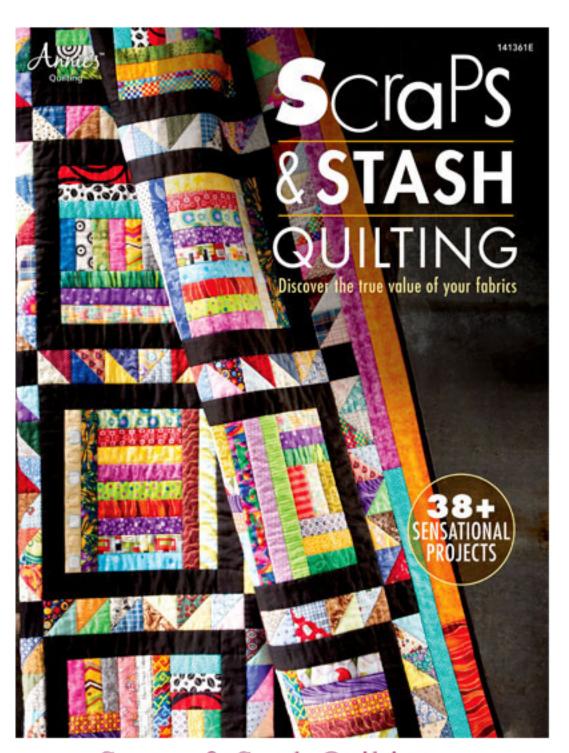


Turning Leaves
