## :Signature Chain

This makes a 12" block!


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## ** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **

Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 and Color 2 2-1/2" x 15" strips into six 2-1/2" squares of each...


Next mark and cut the Color $35^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 13-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip into six $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-$ $1 / 2$ " rectangles. Mark and cut the Color $32-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10$ " strip into four 21/2" squares..

Now sew the five horizontal rows as shown at left, using the standard scant 1/4" seam allowances throughout. To make the middle row, you will sew together two sets of Color 1 and Color 2 squares, then join those to the ends of the Color 3 large rectangle. Connect the rows and your Signature Chain block is done! There's lots of room in the center to use as a signature block, if you want. hence, the name! ...

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Here are four blocks by five with a pieced border, then two plain borders!

Color 3 needs: one 2-1/2" x 10" strip AND one 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangle AND one 5" x 13-1/2" strip
