Orange Quilt

(post edit: <u>go here</u> for a much easier, quicker way to make these blocks.) Seeing as how I'm making <u>this quilt pattern again</u>, I figured I should share the dimensions of it as I go in case you want to make your own!

Cut five pieces: square 4 1/2"

2 rectangles 2 1/2 by 4 1/2"

2 rectangles 2 1/2 by 8 1/2"



Sew 4 ¹/₂" rectangles to block, iron. This is a great and fast pattern for chain piecing!

The final block is 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

(my final blocks end up more like 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ or so, I don't square them up, I just eyeball it as I sew them together. I make sure all of middle pieces, the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces fit together perfectly instead. If that makes sense? It also makes for a bigger quilt top)

To make the orange and white quilt I made it 8 blocks acrossed and 9 blocks down, so 72 blocks total. 36 white border blocks, and 36 orange bordered blocks. (36 white squares, 36 sets of white strips, 36 orange squares, 36 orange sets of strips) It made it about 62" by 68". For my sons twin quilt, I am making it 8 blocks by 12 blocks, which will make it a perfect twin size. The twin sized quilt with this pattern takes roughly 6 ½ yards or so of fabric. Happy Sewing!
