



Evergreen Event Placemat

By Colleen Tauke | Finished Size: 12-1/2" x 18-1/2"



Materials:

Yardage is calculated for a set of 4 placemats

Scraps of coordinating fabrics 1-1/2 yd of focus fabric includes binding 7/8 yd backing fabric Fabric marking pen/pencil Acrylic ruler - 8" x 14",

8-1/2" x 24-1/2" or similar Basting spray or safety pins Batting



Cutting:

The cutting instructions are for **one** placemat. WOF = width of fabric

Scraps:

Cut (12) 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

Focus fabric:

- (1) 12-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangle
- (2) 2-1/2" by WOF for binding

Backing:

(1) 15" x 21" rectangle

Batting:


(1) 15" x 21" rectangles



Construction:

1/4" seams are used for construction

- 1. Working with the 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles, arrange the prints in a pleasing manner. Vary the light and darks. Join the rectangles into a column. In order to keep the column from becoming distorted, stitch the seams with alternating starting points. See video for this discussion. Press seam allowances all in one direction.
- 2. Join the pieced portion to the short side of the focus fabric rectangle, as shown in the diagram below. Press the seam allowance toward the focus fabric.



- 3. Layer the placemat top with batting and backing fabric. Spray baste or pin baste to keep layers fro shifting during quilting.
- 4. Finish each placemat by applying binding to the outer edge.
- 5. Re-imagine this as a festive July 4th, a Spooky Halloween, or a Birthday Bash event! The possibilities are endless.
