

Two by Two

Materials

72 - novelty fabrics
enough to cut (2) matching squares
1-3/4 yd - snowball corners and binding
3-1/4 yds backing

Supplies

Rotary Cutter
Cutting Mat
8-1/2" x 24-1/2" ruler or similar size
Fabric marking pen/pencil
Scissors
Pins
Thread for piecing
Iron and pressing mat

Notes

WOF = width of fabric
RST = right sides together



Cutting


Novelty fabrics - (72) sets of 2 matching 4-1/2" squares

Snowball corners - (576) 1-3/4" squares


Binding - (5) 2-1/2" strips x WOF

Construction

1. Mark each 1-3/4" square with a diagonal line. NOTE: if you have a sewing machine with a laser light or projection capability you can skip this step.



2. NOTE: I oriented all blocks as if looking at a photo - right side up.
3. Stitch a 1-3/4" square RST into the corner of each of the (144) 4-1/2" novelty squares. Follow the diagram for placement of the "snowball" corner squares. Arrange the blocks on a design wall or flat surface to determine placement. There will be 12 rows of 12 blocks. Press the diagonal seams in all the **odd numbered rows to the left** and **even numbered rows to the right**. This will create opposing seams as you join blocks within each row and when you join the rows. **See video for more detail.**



Make 144 snowball blocks

4. Lay patchwork quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired
5. Finish outer edge with binding
6. Enjoy a game of Two by Two.
